An allowance for</li> </ul>	Importers qualifying for concessionary entry (duty and / or tax free) must personally visit Customs to sign 'Deed of Undertaking'.  After clearances (MAF and Customs) are completed motor vehicle will be required to be tested for certification to New Zealand Safety and Compliance Standards - it is important that owner checks prior to shipment that vehicle will comply.  For full details refer to website for the -New Zealand Transport Agency www.nzta.govt.nz  It is recommended that motor vehicles be steam-cleaned and vacuumed prior to shipment however this is not a guarantee MAF will not order again on arrival in New Zealand.

Wooden Packaging		Effective 1st July 2006 any wood packaging used in shipments entering New Zealand must comply with the ISPM 15 standard and carry the appropriate mark.  Consignments that contain non-compliant wood packaging will be treated, destroyed or re-exported at the discretion of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF BNZ).
